

Dairy directorate and central dairy laboratory to come up in Haldwani

Dairy Development minister Saurabh Bahuguna did Bhumi Pujan for the dairy directorate building and central dairy laboratory in Haldwani on Saturday. The directorate building will be constructed at a cost of Rs 4.99 crore while the laboratory will be built at a cost of Rs two crore. Speaking on the occasion, Bahuguna said that the construction of these facilities will ensure that consumers get quality milk and dairy products. This will also make the dairy business a strong component of the State's rural economy. He said that purity is the strength of the Aanchal brand, claiming that no other brand can compete with it in this aspect. Every person in Uttarakhand should try and promote the Aanchal brand at his or her level, he added. On the demand of dairy producers, the minister announced



that they will be able to purchase Aanchal cattle feed at lower prices. Regarding the modern dairy plant in Lalkuan, Bahuguna said that a proposal amounting to Rs 80 crore had been prepared and submitted to the Central government for approval. Work on the project will begin soon after the approval is granted. He also exhorted all the citi-

zens to contribute for tending to abandoned cattle. The Uttarakhand cooperative dairy federation administrator Mukesh Bora said that the dairy directorate building and central dairy laboratory are being built on about 25 bigha land due to Bahuguna's efforts. He also raised various issues in front of the Dairy Development minister.

Head-on collision between car & jeep leaves one dead, four critically injured

With accidents continuing in the mountainous regions of the State, one person died and four were injured after a vehicle fell down the mountainside after colliding head-on with another vehicle near Jadipani on the Chamba-Mussoorie Road. Four of the injured were in a serious condition and were referred to the All India Institute of Medical Sciences (AIIMS) in Rishikesh.

According to sources, a car and a jeep collided near Jadipani on the Chamba-Mussoorie Road on Saturday morning. The car fell down the mountainside following the collision. One person died on the spot and five persons were injured. Out of the injured persons, four were referred to AIIMS Rishikesh in a serious condition. The car was being driven from Chamba towards Dhanaulti



when it collided head-on with a jeep coming from the opposite direction near Jadipani. The driver of the car lost control after the collision, causing the vehicle to fall down the mountainside. On being informed about the mishap, the Chamba police and State Disaster Response Force (SDRF)

team reached the accident site. The police and SDRF teams rescued the injured persons from the gorge. One person identified as Tushar Pandey, who was travelling in the car died on the spot. A total of four persons were travelling in the car and two were in the jeep at the time of the accident. The district disaster management officer Brijesh Bhatt said that the five injured persons were first taken to the Chamba community health centre by ambulance. Four of the persons with serious injuries were referred to AIIMS Rishikesh. According to sources, it is being reported that the accident occurred when one of the vehicles was in the process of overtaking another vehicle and collided with the vehicle coming from the opposite direction. The police investigation is expected to ascertain the exact cause of the mishap.

It is worth mentioning here that under the Ayushman Bhava Yojana, a service fortnight will be organised from September 17 to October 2. In the programme Ayushman cards and ABHA IDs will be made and health fairs will be organised in the health and wellness centres. Blood donation camps, sanitation campaigns, organ donation pledge and TB free society campaign will also be organised in the fortnight. The Health minister Dhan Singh Rawat said that the Ayushman Bhava programme is being organised under the overall guidance of Prime Minister Narendra Modi in all parts of the country. He claimed that

the programme will be the biggest such programme in the health sector. The minister said that the government is committed to provide proper health facilities to the person standing on the last rung of the social ladder. He expressed confidence that the health services in the state will get strengthened by the organisation of blood donation camps and voluntary organ donation pledge during the fortnight. The additional director of the SHA, Atul Joshi said that responsibilities have been assigned to the officers and employees for the service fortnight. He said that a campaign will be organised to make health cards for the people whose cards have not yet been made. The chief executive officer of the SHA, Anand Srivastava said that the entire set up of SHA has been directed to ensure better performance for the success of the service fortnight. He warned that laxity will not be tolerated at any level during the programme. In Uttarakhand, Ayushman cards of 52.10 lakh people have been made so far while a total of 56.65 ABHA IDs have been made.

The State meteorological centre has issued a yellow warning (watch) regarding the possibility of heavy rain likely to occur at isolated places in Dehradun, Nainital, Rudrapur, Chamoli, Bageshwar and Pithoragarh districts on Sunday.

Thunderstorms accompanied with lightning and intense/very intense spells of rain are likely to occur at isolated places in districts of the State today. Further, light to moderate rain/thunderstorms are likely to occur at many

places in Haridwar, Champawat and Udham Singh Nagar districts and at most places in the remaining districts of the State. The provisional State capital Dehradun is forecast to witness a generally cloudy sky. One to two spells of light to moderate rain/thunderstorms are likely to occur, which may be intense in some areas.

The maximum and minimum temperatures are likely to be about 30 degrees Celsius and 22 degrees Celsius respectively in Dehradun today.

SRHU observes World Ozone Day

Swami Rama Himalayan University's Himalayan School of Biosciences observed World Ozone Day on Saturday by hosting various programmes to raise awareness about the alarming level of ozone layer depletion and its adverse consequences on the environment. While the scientific advisor, Himalayan School of Biosciences CS Nautiyal provided a scientific perspective on ozone layer depletion, SRHU professor Sanjay Gupta underscored the critical significance of preserving the ozone layer on a global scale in his address, urging all to play proactive role in the matter.

Notably, the United Nations General Assembly proclaimed September 16 to be observed globally as the International Day for the preservation of the Ozone layer in December 1994 in commemoration of the date on which the Montreal protocol on Substances that deplete the Ozone layer was signed in 1987. Importantly, the protocol signified international agreement and collaboration in reducing ozone-depleting substances in the environment. The theme for 2023 is 'Montreal Protocol: Fixing the Ozone Layer and Reducing Climate Change.'
