Addressing students at the 85th convocation of Annamalai University in Chidambaram, he said it is important to take calculated risks to succeed in any venture. "There is a chance that you may fail; but if you overcome the failure, then you can succeed. Take the risk of inno-

pointed out that the ISRO had taken many calculated risks along with innovations while conducting the series of lander special tests. "Finally, with a systematic execution of the project, we have achieved the safe and soft-landing technology, marking a significant milestone in India's iconic space journey," he

Stating that energy, water, environmental control, and climate change require immediate attention, he said that all problems have to be solved with sustainable development goals in mind. The younger generation must play a crucial role in realising the coun-

try's aspirations of achieving technology leadership in these emerging areas, he said.

"India has taken the risk and used innovative methods to develop all the technologies indigenously. Though we have faced failures, the end result is fruitful. Now, the day-today life of each citizen in India is linked with space technology in one way or the other."

"Typical applications using earth observation satellites are providing reliable data for disaster management, crop

management, and identification of potential fishing zones. In addition to va-

rious achievements of IS-RO, advanced Research and Development activities in satellite domain, launch vehicle domain. and propulsion domain are in full swing in various centres of the organisation," he added.

Governor R.N. Ravi awarded doctoral, postgraduate, and undergraduate degrees, and diplomas under the faculties of arts, science, marine sciences, arts and fine arts to 1,010 candidates. # Rise in caste atrocities in T.N. a cause for concern, says Governor R.N. Ravi

Tamil Nadu Governor R.N. Ravi on Wednesday expressed concern over the "rise in caste atrocities in the State".

Presiding over the Guru Pooja of Swami Nandhanar organised by Tamil Seva Sangam at Adhanur village near Kattumannarkovil in the district, he said that although the trend of caste discrimination was being witnessed across the country, Tamil Nadu was witnessing a greater rise in

atrocities, caste-based which is a matter of con-

Mr. Ravi said the response of the law enforcement and criminal justice system was "awful" when it came to crimes against the Dalits and the rate of conviction was only 7% in rape cases, in which the survivors were women from the Scheduled Castes.

He referred to various incidents including the mixing of human faeces in a water tank in a Dalit hamlet in Vengaivayal, denial of entry into temples, and discrimination at local bo-

'Worrying trend'

The Governor said a section of students in schools in Tamil Nadu had been identifying themselves with caste by wearing tags and bands on their wrists. "This is a matter of concern and I do not know what kind of culture is this," he rued. A woman who was elected as president of a Panchayat union was yet to assume office

because she belonged to a

Scheduled Caste commun-

ity. This trend in the escalation of caste atrocities should be viewed seriously, he said.

The Governor also stressed the need for the people to live with mutual understanding and said that one should not give room for any barriers. The country had been transformed only after Narendra Modi became the Prime Minister. He has been looking at the country as one organic family, he said adding that this was also the dream of poet Subramaniya Bharathiyar.
