Cong seeks 'representation as per population', caste census

ASTHE Election Commission (EC) announced the schedule for the Assembly polls in five states, the Congress strategy was clear Monday — test the caste gambit in these elections, and amplify it later for the Lok Sabha.

After a Congress Working Committee meeting, the party asserted that if elected to power, it will hold a caste census and remove the 50% ceiling on reservations for SC, ST and backward classes through a legislation, to give them representation according to their population. This came days after Prime Minister Narendra Modi turned the slogan voicing this, "Jitni aabadi, utna haq", first given by Rahul Gandhi during the Karnataka Assembly elections, to attack the Congress.

The high-stakes state elections are crucial pit-stops for both the Congress and BJP before the Lok Sabha elections in April-May 2024, especially for the main Opposition party, as a win in the

two states it holds and coming to power in another would help it position itself as the dominant player within the INDIA alliance, and strengthen its hands in the seat-sharing sweepstakes.

The party seems to be banking hard on the OBC card, projecting caste census as a "powerful step" for the emancipation of the poor, which would "open a new paradigm for development". Attacking the "Jitni aabadi, utna haq" slogan, Modi had said that for the BJP, the only caste is the poor.

The CWC — whose meeting coincided with the EC poll schedule announcement Monday — spent most of the time sharpening the Congress's social justice plank. A resolution passed at the meeting said that if voted to power at the Centre, the party will conduct a nationwide caste census as part of the normal decadal Census, which was due in 2021 but has been postponed.

The party also said it will "implement 33% reservation for women in the Lok Sabha and state Assemblies at the earliest, while ensuring adequate representation

for women belonging to SCs, STs and OBCs". It said the "obstacles" imposed on the Census and Lok Sabha seat delimitation by the Modi government will be removed.

Besides, the party said, it "will remove the cap of 50% through legislation for the reservation of OBCs, SCs and STs, in line with the commensurate share of population".

Earlier, the CWC, at its meeting in Hyderabad on September 15-16, had called for increasing the existing upper limit of reservations for SCs, STs and OBCs.

Addressing a press conference after the CWC meeting, where the party's four chief ministers were present, Rahul Gandhi stressed that three of them are from OBC communities, while pointing out that the BJP has only one OBC CM (among 10). "And he (Shivraj Singh Chouhan) won't remain CM in a few days," he said.

Rahul claimed PM Modi is incapable of getting a caste census done, as he does not work for the welfare of OBCs. "The RSS and Modi have put in place a system

to distract attention of OBCs, Dalits and tribals from the truth regarding their representation. And Modi is the main instrument... Unkayahi kaam hai ki Bhaiya, OBC ki bhagidari na ho... dhyan idhar udhar jaata jaaye (His job is to ensure that the attention of OBCs is diverted, so that they don't get their due!)"

The CWC resolution said: "The Modi government has cheated the OBC communities and other deprived sections of the country by not releasing the data of the 2011 Socio Economic and Caste Census and not carrying out a fresh caste census. It has also failed in its constitutional duty by inordinately postponing the decadal Census that ought to have been conducted in 2021 or soon thereafter."

It said the final figures of the Bihar caste survey have revealed the disparity between share in population and representation, and highlighted the urgent need to take effective steps to ensure social justice. A nationwide caste census, it said, will reveal an accurate picture of the socio-economic position of communities across the country, and provide a sound, data-driven basis for policies to strengthen the foundations of social justice, and ensure inclusive development.

Rahul said that once the caste census, "our foundation", has been achieved, "we will replicate at the national level what he (pointing to Ashok Gehlot) has done in healthcare in Rajasthan, what he (pointing to Bhupesh Baghel) is doing for farmers, his (pointing to Siddaramaiah) social security structure... We are planning to implement these at the national level."

Addressing the CWC, Congress president Mallikarjun Kharge asked party workers to work in tandem, with discipline and unity, and put in all their might to win the Assembly elections.

While supporting caste census and the need for representation for OBC communities, sources said a couple of members — including Adhir Ranjan Chowdhury and Jitendra Singh — urged the party to be careful, as the ruling BJP could try and portray that the party was indifferent to the interests of other castes. When one member pointed out that the party should talk about the situation of SCs and STs, Rahul pointed out that the party is not against anyone, and that the census is for all. He admitted that some parties in the INDIA alliance may have a "slightly different position" on caste census. "That is fine, we are flexible... But I'm confident the vast majority of the INDIA alliance is going to support a caste census," he said.

and cricket. The ED has claimed that money was transferred from the owners of the app to hawala operators in Chhattisgarh, with the trail allegedly leading up to bureaucrats and politicians.

The two alleged kingpins that the agency has narrowed in on are Sourabh Chandrakar, 28, and Ravi Uppal, 43, both Bihari residents believed to be on the run in Dubai.

Police said it was around 2017-2018 that Uppal and Chandrakar started the app. Though they came from vastly different backgrounds — Uppal from a business family, while Chandrakar was the son of a former employee of the Bihari Municipal Corporation — their paths crossed at the paan stall in Akash Ganga market, where they bonded over cricket scores.

Earlier this year, the Chhattisgarh Police issued a lookout notice against the duo while the ED initiated the process of issuing a red-corner notice.

It was Chandrakar's February wedding in the UAE's Ras Al-Khaima city, for which he is said to have splurged over Rs 200 crore, that set off alarm bells. The ED is now issuing notices and summons to around 16 celebrities who were allegedly paid in cash for performing at Chandrakar's wedding. Those who have been called for questioning include actors Ranbir Kapoor, Shradha Kapoor, Huma Qureshi, Hina Khan and comedian Kapil Sharma.

The kingpins in Bihilai

Police sources said Chandrakar worked as a salesman at a garment store in Bihilai, earning Rs 10,000 a month, be-

fore he started a juice corner, called 'Juice Factory'. Chandrakar's alleged business partner and co-founder of the app, Uppal, came from an upper-middle-class family.

Police sources said that while Uppal took up contracts for installing borewells and had an oil-related business before he moved to Dubai, he has been involved in betting for over a decade. His network of cricket bookies, they said, are spread across states — from Katni in Madhya Pradesh to Bilaspur, Raipur, Bhatapara and Dhamtari in Chhattisgarh.

It was at Akash Ganga market that Uppal would catch up with friends, mostly local punters. When he was introduced to Chandrakar there, Uppal realised the latter's strong local connections would come in handy to recruit for the app.

Around 2017-2018, the duo first got in touch with makers of a similar Hyderabad-based app before taking the help of software engineers to set up their own.

Much before the Covid lockdown, they began making the rounds of Dubai, where they eventually set up operations.

The Uppals' bungalow in Bihilai now stands locked, with police saying the family recently left the city. The place where Chandrakar ran a juice centre has been taken over by another person.

When a salesman strikes big

While Chandrakar and Uppal ran their operations from Dubai, the face of the app in Bihilai was Raja Gupta alias Raj, a 29-year-old whose fortunes

are said to have changed overnight since he started working for them.

He, too, is believed to be in Dubai.

A school dropout, until 2016, Raj worked as a salesman in a garment shop in Akash Ganga market, earning Rs 1,600 a month, before he took to betting — and later accepting bets — on cricket.

Said his friend: "We both used to lose money on bets but we were addicted. One day he said that if we accept bets, we will make more money. Then, Raj was introduced to Sourabh (Chandrakar) who told him that he would make him rich."

Not much later, says the friend, Raj's lifestyle underwent a drastic makeover. He bought an i20 car and an iPhone, wore gold ornaments, and had a flamboyant presence on social media — leading many in Supela to believe he was the app's owner.

When The Indian Express visited Raj's bungalow in Bihilai, his father refused to talk. His sister said Raj has not come home in two years.

Investigators say Raj's job was to allegedly recruit youngsters from Chhattisgarh and take them to Dubai for selling customer login IDs for several lakhs to operators. While the app owners kept the lion's share of profits, punters such as Raj got around 20 per cent.

Bihilai to Dubai for a dream

According to the police, a key part of the betting operation involved youngsters who were tasked with handling the backend operations. Many of these 150-odd youngsters — from UP,

Bihar, MP, Chhattisgarh and Jharkhand — were taken to Dubai for "training". While some stayed on, the others were sent back to India to handle operations here.

Among those who went to Dubai is a 29-year-old from Bihilai who spoke to The Indian Express on the condition of anonymity.

A small-time bookie, he says that after he lost a "few lakhs" on the bets he placed through Raj, the latter offered him a "job" in Dubai.

"I desperately wanted money to repay my debts so I went to Dubai in December 2021. There were around 70 of us from Chhattisgarh and we stayed in a villa for six months. I was paid Rs 40,000 a month. They paid for our food and stay, and we got to roam around Dubai," he says.

"I hear there are 250 branches that control the app, each with seven men who handle the money," he says, adding that each branch made at least Rs 15 to Rs 20 lakh a week.

In May 2022, with news of the ED and police raids, he returned home to Bihilai. While he continued to manage the operations of a Chhattisgarh-based branch, he kept losing money on bets. "A few months later, the police arrested me and I was paraded in a press conference. The court released me, but my life is a mess. A colleague from whom I borrowed Rs 1.50 lakh is threatening to kill me if I do not repay. My father had to sell our house to get me married and repay some of my debts. I am done with gambling. I hope the government shuts down the app," says the 29-year-old, who now sells papdi bhel for a living.

Vocal for local: NSG weeds out vilayati kikar on Manesar campus

In the past couple of years, the NSG has planted nearly 10 lakh saplings of local varieties on the hills using the trench pattern of plantation to ensure judicious use of water. This pattern of plantation involves plots that are ploughed to create trench-like rows for sowing of saplings. These trenches help channel rainwater through the plantation, keeping it irrigated.

A site visit by The Indian Express revealed that a significantly large number of these saplings had survived. NSG commandos were seen pruning and cutting down existing kikar trees before fresh plantation.

For the section of the campus that lies on the foothills of the Aravallis, the force has hired experts in Miyawaki plantation. The Japanese method relies on overcrowding the plantation area with saplings of different varieties to create competition that propels faster growth.

"The Union Home Minister has set ambitious annual plantation targets for all Central Armed Police Forces (CAPFs). We felt that these targets could be incorporated into a larger rewilding plan for the Manesar campus of the NSG. So a five-year plan, commencing from 2021-22, was designed to prune vilayati kikar on around 700 acres of the Aravallis (campus) and to plant local species (instead). The NSG also intends to develop forest patches in

and around 300 acres of the area in the non-Aravallis stretch of the Manesar campus." NSG Director General M A Ganapathy said, adding that his aim was to make the campus "carbon neutral".

Since the Aravalli hills are naturally arid with poor availability of water, barring the rainy season, the force is also dredging the range's troughs that have been selected geospatially to trap rainwater and create water bodies that will not only recharge the water table but also make water available around the year. One such water body has already been created by trapping water discharged from water treatment plants on campus.

"Our water table has been going down constantly. Apart from massive urban development around the campus over the past few years, among the reasons (for this depletion of the water table) was also the ubiquitous vilayati kikar. So a decision was taken to populate the hills with native varieties as well," said NSG Group Commander Jagdish Maithani, who is leading the project.

However, their initial efforts came a cropper. "We had planted around 1 lakh trees in 2021, but only 3 per cent survived," said Maithani.

The force then roped in the Haryana forest department, environmental experts and NGOs, who pointed out that as long as kikar trees were around, the

chances of survival of other species would remain slim.

"We decided to cut kikar trees and to keep pruning them until the new plants grew tall enough to survive the tough conditions. Pruned branches of the trees were used to make fences to keep the nilgai from entering the plantation area. The current survival rate of the saplings is 90 per cent," Maithani said.

Environmentalist Vijay Dhasmana, who was consulted by the NSG for the project, said the vilayati kikar is an invasive species that can quickly colonise an entire area, and its roots and leaves secrete certain alkaloids that prevent the growth of other species. Since herbivores do not prefer it either, it has a negative impact on the biodiversity of an area. "Also, its canopy blocks the sun, preventing the growth of understorey. These trees must be pruned so that other plants get a chance to establish themselves. And then the kikar can be removed," he said.

Conservationist Sunil Harsana, who is responsible for the afforestation of Delhi's Mangar Bani forest and was also consulted by the NSG, said the kikar roots spread across underneath the turf and suck all the moisture in the soil. "Also, since they shed leaves for a very short period, they need water all year. This can lead to the depletion of the water table," he said.

Dhasmana, however, said there were no conclusive studies

of kikar's impact on the water table.

According to the NSG, local tree varieties being used for the drive are being planted in 50-100 metres plots surrounded by fences and maintained by commandos. In rocky areas, trees like dhok, dhak, salar, ranjh, phulai, pahadi papri, bistendu, gundi, chamroth, moringa, amaltas and peepal will be planted. Valley areas will see native varieties such as bama, kala siris, kaim, amaltas, moringa and neem. In the sandy plains, khejri, pillu, jaal, rohedra, amla, kanker and ashok will be planted. Besides karonda, gangeti and arna as shrubs for undergrowth, the saplings will be interspersed with fruit trees like chikoo, mango, jamun, guava and bel, the NSG said.

The force has tied up with NGOs Bhumi and Catch for the implementation of the project. To ensure water supply, the force has built a water tank over the hill where water is lifted from the ground using a solar pump. Each plot also has a pit to collect rainwater. In plots that are remote, only varieties that are not eaten by nilgaus have been planted.

A forest department official said the department has been providing saplings to the force.

The official added, "The NSG has a huge target (for its plantation drive). If it succeeds, the entire landscape (of the area) will change."

Minor abducted, raped in Rajkot; three neighbours arrested: Cops
