

D Raja accuses Union govt of misusing agencies, criticises Congress in Kerala

He also brought to light the ongoing struggle to protect democracy and secularism in India

CPI GENERAL secretary D Raja launched a tirade against both Congress and the BJP during a press conference in Kozhikode on Monday. Raja accused the Union government of systematically targeting opposition leaders using central agencies and highlighted the political turmoil in Kerala involving Chief Minister Pinarayi Vijayan.

He said the UDF's political stance lacks clarity. Raja equated Congress leader Rahul Gandhi's question suggesting Enforcement Directorate (ED) action against Chief Minister Pinarayi Vijayan with the arrest of Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal and former

Jharkhand CM Hemant Soren. He also called out Rahul for his inconsistent positions regarding these arrests.

"Rahul Gandhi's contradictory stance in demanding the arrest of Kejriwal in Delhi while questioning similar actions in Kerala shows a misunderstanding of the political situation," Raja stated.

Raja also brought to light the ongoing struggle to protect democracy, secularism, and federalism in India. He underscored the challenges faced by the country under the cur-

rent BJP-led government such as increasing economic inequality, unemployment, inflation, and the centralisation of power that, according to him, undermines state autonomy.

He also lambasted Prime Minister Narendra Modi's alleged silence on the recent unrest in states like Manipur and specific policies.

As Kerala gears up for the significant elections, Raja emphasised that the main goal for the Left is to counter the communal-fascist-pro corporate policies promoted by the BJP, a

stance he claims the Congress is unclear about. He exuded confidence that the electorate in Kerala would respond unfavourably to the Congress' approach, particularly to their personal attacks on the chief minister.

Supporting Raja's views, CPI district secretary K K Balan and leaders like A Pradeep Kumar said that the upcoming election is a battle between LDF's grassroots activism and the privileged politics of the UDF and BJP. "The BJP spending hefty amounts on election advertisements funded by dubious means and the increasingly elitist nature of the Parliament underscore the urgent need for a strong Left presence to advocate for the common people," Raja said.

Valaramkundu ST colony residents demand probe into unnatural deaths of residents in K'taka

THE Valaramkundu Scheduled Tribe colony residents in the Wayanad district have begun an indefinite strike demanding a comprehensive probe into the deaths of several colony residents in the plantations at Kodagu in Karnataka. The family of Santhosh Raju of Koythupara Valaramkundu Kattunayakan Colony in Vellamunda and other residents started the indefinite strike urging an inquiry into the death of Santhosh, who was a daily wage worker at a ginger farm in Kodagu. According to source, he drowned in a river under mysterious circumstances.

Santhosh's father Raju had lodged a complaint with the police and ST development officials after the unnatural death of Santhosh near the ginger plantation in Kodagu last year, seeking a comprehensive inquiry into the incident.

Valaramkundu Colony, which is situated in a remote forest area, has around 73 families comprising more than 300

residents mostly belonging to the Kattunayakan and Paniya ST communities. The colony residents are often hired by the landlords from Karnataka, especially Kodagu people, for plantation and other cultivation works through agents in Wayanad.

These residents stay at the plantation for months until their work is done. However, many ST workers from Wayanad have been facing both mental and physical torture at their

workplaces in Kodagu. Arun, a resident of Panavally Kalindi ST Colony in Wayanad, had alleged mental and physical torture at a plantation in Karnataka last year and approached the Thirunelli police seeking protection.

demanding a compensation for the victims who died in similar circumstances.

Valaramkundu Koythupara Samara samithi convener A Balakrishnan inaugurated the strike on Sunday. Balakrishnan and Raju on behalf of the Samara Samithi requested the support of activists and common people from all over Kerala.

Raju has informed that the strike will be strengthened with more participation of people and that it will continue until their demands are met. Meanwhile, the police officials informed that they have several limitations in conducting the probe into Santhosh's death.

FOLLOWING A swift probe spanning two states, the Kerala Police nabbed the thief who de-camped with gold and diamonds worth ₹1 crore from the house of Malayalam filmmaker Joshiy in Kochi's Panampilly Nagar, from Udipi in Karnataka on Sunday, within 24 hours of the theft. Suspect Mohammed Irshad, a native of Bihar, was nabbed with the stolen valuables with the help of the Karnataka Police. A grainy image of the suspect, captured by a CCTV camera, was all the police had as evidence when they launched probe on Saturday morning.

However, the police got a breakthrough when the visuals revealed that a vehicle registered in Maharashtra was parked near the filmmaker's house around 3am on Saturday. Using the latest technology, the police identified Irshad from the grainy image.

Man apologises for burning Samastha mouthpiece

THE Kodinhi native, who burned the Samastha mouthpiece "Suprabhaatham" newspaper publicly for carrying an LDF election campaign advertisement, apologised to the Samastha workers and leaders for his act on Sunday. A video of the individual, Komukutty Haji, apologising for burning the newspaper was shared on social media on the day. "I apologise for burning the newspaper, and I understand

that my act has caused the Samastha members to worry," said Komukutty Haji. Meanwhile, while reacting to the incident of burning the newspaper, IUML national general secretary P K Kunhalikitty mocked the LDF tagline that translates to 'India will not sustain without the Left'. "The Left parties are weaker outside Kerala. They need the support of the Congress to win elections outside Kerala. Then how can they say India will not sustain without Left parties?" Kunhalikitty asked.
