

Posters against Cong. leadership appear again in Thrissur

Panel inquiring failure in LS polls meets leaders; V.K. Sreekandan had warned of action against those engaging in poster campaigns

Indicating that problems in the Congress party in Thrissur are unlikely to die down easily, posters against the district party leadership appeared again in the city on Tuesday.

Posters appeared in front of the District Congress Committee (DCC) office and in the city against Kerala Pradesh Congress Committee working president T.N. Prathapan.

Posters calling Mr. Prathapan an 'agent of the Sangh Parivar' and 'curse of Thrissur' also demand disciplinary action against him. "Don't dream of contesting from Manalur," reads another poster.

The posters appeared

on Tuesday as the subcommittee led by senior leader K.C. Joseph arrived at the DCC office to inquire into the failure of the United Democratic Front candidate in the Thrissur Lok Sabha constituency. The panel met leaders in the district. Posters criticising the party district leadership started appearing af-

ter the pathetic failure of the UDF in the Thrissur Lok Sabha constituency.

Resignation

The poster controversy and clashes between the two groups in the DCC led to the resignation of DCC president Jose Vallur and UDF district chairman M.P. Vincent.

After taking charge as the temporary DCC president on Sunday, Palakkad MP-designate V.K. Sreekandan categorically said that strict action would be taken against those who were trying to demean the party through posters and campaigns.

However, the posters appeared again giving indications that the skirmishes in the Congress party in Thrissur will continue.

The Save Nimisha Priya International Action Council has appealed to the people for their contributions to rescue the Malayali nurse awaiting capital punishment in a Yemen jail.

Nimisha Priya, hailing from Kollengode in the district, has been languishing in a Yemen jail since 2014 in connection with the death of a Yemeni citizen. She has been awarded death sentence by the Su-

preme Court of Yemen. Action council leaders K. Babu, MLA, Moosa, and

Kunjammad Koorachundu said here on Tuesday that her execution could take

place anytime and, therefore, discussions to save her through blood money should begin forthwith.

They said that the lawyer appointed by the Indian Embassy had agreed to find interlocutors for Nimisha Priya. But this process alone would cost 40,000 dollars. If the victim's family agrees to the blood money offer, then the interlocutors should be convinced that the funds are ready.

Action council leaders said that they should con-

vince the interlocutors that at least ₹3 crore are deposited in their account. They said if 60,000 people chip in ₹500 each, they could easily raise ₹3 crore.

"This is an appeal to the people. Please help us save a woman from execution," they said.

Congress leader Priyanka Gandhi Vadra will secure a larger majority than Rahul Gandhi in Wayanad bypoll, Leader of the Opposition V.D. Satheesan has said.

He was interacting with media persons in Chalakkudy on Tuesday.

"Priyanka Gandhi is a leading fighter against fascism in the country. She has a better connection with Wayanad than those who criticise her candidature. Members of the Nehru family keep good relations with people in the country," he said.

Not the first time

"Is it for the first time that political leaders are contesting from two seats. Many leaders, including Prime Minister Narendra Modi himself, had contested from two seats. If they win from both seats, they have to leave one. There's nothing unusual about it.

Earlier they said Rahul Gandhi was scared of contesting from north India."

Did the Union Ministers who were Rajya Sabha members from various States, keep good contacts there? he asked. Mr. Gandhi and Ms. Vadra had better contacts with Wayanad people, he said.

"No decision has been taken on the candidates for Chelakkara and Palakkad byelections," Mr. Satheesan said.

Indications showed that the Communist Party of India (Marxist) [CPI(M)] would face the same fate in Kerala as in West Bengal and Tripura.

The 'Kafir' controversy in Vadakara showed that they would play any dirty game to win.

Even the Sangh Parivar would be ashamed in front of their dirty strategies. Roots of the CPI(M) had decayed.

Pinarayi Vijayan would ensure its end, Mr. Satheesan added.

New SCERT textbooks impart lessons on scientific, sustainable waste management

As Kerala implements the Malinya Mukta Nava Keralam campaign under the umbrella of the Local Self Government department (LSGD) with the goal of becoming a garbage-free State, it is also trying to impart lessons in sustainable waste management practices to young minds.

New textbooks prepared by the State Council of Educational Research and Training (SCERT) for Classes III, V, VII, and IX as part of curriculum revision have content on significance of scientific and sustainable waste management practices to enhance awareness of the issue

among students and bring about an attitudinal change. The inclusion of the subject in the curriculum was the result of discussions held by the Kerala Suchitwa Mission, Haritha Kerala Mission, and the Malinya Mukta Nava Keralam campaign secretariat with the Director of General Education (DGE).

Waste management figures in the textbooks 'Jeevasasthram' for Class IX, Hindi 'Patavali' for Class VII, 'Adisthana Sasthram' for Class V, and the Malayalam textbook and 'Parisara Patanam' for Class III.

"The inclusion of waste management and related topics in school textbooks is a major intervention aimed at bringing about an

attitudinal change on a major challenge faced by the society. This will greatly help young ones have a proper understanding of the issues involved and formation of their character as responsible citizens of the future," U.V. Jose, executive director, Suchitwa Mission, said.

Easy descriptions

Sections on the subject have easy-to-grasp descriptions, tables, poems, illustrations, and assignments for students, giving them a clear awareness of the issues involved and how they can help improve the situation around them.

The lessons use the medium of writing letters to a friend. A section headlined

'My school, clean school' tells the students how they can ensure cleanliness in

their school, assess the standard of cleanliness, basic yardsticks of cleanliness, and the ill-effects of throwing waste around indiscriminately.

Various stages

They also inform the students about various stages and processes of waste management such as collection at source, use of different types of waste bins, turning food waste into compost, and the pollution caused by burning plastic materials.

The lessons underscore the importance of keeping one's surroundings clean and free of waste to maintain environmental sustainability and ensure community health.

Posting of Health dept. faculty to Palakkad GMC: KGMCTA demands withdrawal of order

The Kerala Government Medical College Teachers' Association (KGMCTA) has demanded the State government to withdraw an order issued by the Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes (SC/ST) Development department appointing on deputation teaching faculty from medical colleges under the Health department to the Palakkad

Government Medical College (GMC).

The SC/ST department had issued the said order to end a strike that was being carried on by students at the Palakkad GMC, which is under the SC/ST department, against the shortage of faculty and staff at the institution.

At present, even medical colleges under the Health department do not have the required level of faculty as specified by the

National Medical Commission (NMC). Even in the Idukki Government Medical College, students are on strike citing the shortage of faculty and other deficiencies. In such a situation, moving the faculty from other medical colleges to the Palakkad GMC will only throw the functioning of medical colleges in the State into disarray, the KGMCTA said in a statement here on Tuesday. Even when the number of

courses in the medical colleges under the Health department were increased, there was only a nominal increase in the posts of faculty and other staff in these institutions.

The KGMCTA said at present, over 300 posts of Assistant Professor were lying vacant in medical colleges in the State. The NMC has served show cause notice to the government pointing out the shortage of faculty and non-teach-

ing staff. In such a situation, the demand that doctors and staff in other medical colleges be sent on deputation to fill the staff shortage at Palakkad GMC will negatively impact the entire medical education sector. The order issued by the SC/ST department should be withdrawn and necessary alternatives found for the resolution of issues at Palakkad GMC, KGMCTA said in a statement here.
