

Inspired by Krishna & Arjuna: CM on HYDRAA

Rich individuals constructed structures within FTL, diverted drainage water to Gandipet & other lakes: Revanth

STATING categorically that he would not succumb to pressure and will continue to take strict action against the illegal structures constructed in the full tank level (FTL) of lakes, Chief Minister A Revanth Reddy said that he took inspiration from the Bhagavad Gita to order the demolishing of illegal structures.

Addressing a gathering after laying the foundation stone for the Hare Krishna Heritage Tower in Kokapet on Sunday, the CM noted that the government was firm in its resolve to remove encroachments on lakes and government lands. He said that several rich individuals constructed structures within the FTL and diverted the drainage water to Gandipet and other lakes which supply drinking water to Hyderabad. "If I do not take any action, it will be construed that I have failed as a people's representative. That is why I formed the HYDRAA and took action de-

spite several pressures," Revanth Reddy said.

Speaking about the Gita, the chief minister said that during the Kurukshetra war, Arjuna dropped his weapons and refused to fight in the battle as he was unwilling to kill his brethren for the sake of ruling the kingdom. At that time, Krishna encouraged Arjuna to participate in the battle to protect Dharma, he added.

"The government has under-

taken this programme with a will to provide better lives to the future generations. Our government stands for righteousness in the spirit of Lord Krishna's teachings," the CM said. Meanwhile, he said that the Hare Krishna Heritage Tower will stand at 430 feet and is the pride of Telangana. The construction of this tower will be completed in around 40 months and will be inaugurated by the chief minister. IT and

In 58 days, HYDRAA clears 166 encroachment

The Hyderabad Disaster Relief and Asset Protection Agency (HYDRAA) is using its full force to remove encroachments on lakes and government lands. Within 58 days since it came into being, the HYDRAA has removed 166 encroachments and reclaimed 43.94 acres from encroachers in lakes, parks, nalas, etc.

On Sunday, the HYDRAA submitted its report to the government detailing the encroachments removed and extent of land recovered so far. As per the report, the structures demolished by the HYDRAA belonged to senior Congress leader and former Union minister MM Pallam Raju's brother, MLAs and MLCs from AIMIM and BRB.

The agency started its first demolition on June 26 in Film Nagar Co-Operative Society

and recovered 0.16 acres. A businessman, Gokul Narne, had encroached a part of the Lotus Pond park and built a compound wall, the report revealed. On August 18, as many as 24 encroachments were dismantled in Gandipet lake (Osman Sagar) at Khanapur and Chilkur villages and 15.25 acres of land were recovered.

The agency demolished two buildings, a compound wall and 11 temporary sheds in the extent of 8.75 acres at Khanapur. Similarly, at Chilkur, six buildings and three compound walls in the extent of 6.5 acres were dismantled. One of the demolished structures built in the encroached Gandipet lake land was ORO Sports Village belonging to Pallam Raju's brother Pallam Anand, while three others were built by former TDP member GV Bhasker Rao of Kaveri Seeds, BJP leader Sunil Reddy and Anupama, wife of Pro Kabaddi owner Srinivas Rao. Sunil Reddy unsuccessfully contested in the 2023 Assembly election from Manthani on BJP ticket.

Darshan's pic in jail raises doubts of VIP treatment

A photo of actor Darshan Thougudeepa, who is lodged at Parappana Agrahara in connection with the kidnap and murder of Renukaswamy, holding a cigarette and chatting with other inmates inside the prison, and the visuals of a video call purportedly made from the prison surfaced on Sunday, raising doubts that the prison staff might have extended preferential treatment to the actor.

In the photo that is doing the rounds, Darshan is seen sitting with his manager Nagaraj -- also an accused in the Renukaswamy murder case, and rowdy-sheeters, Wilson Garden Naga and Kulla Seena, inside the quarantined area of the prison, where high-security prisoners are generally lodged. In the photo, which appears to have been clicked from the window of a cell, the actor is seen holding a coffee mug in one hand and a lit cigarette in the other.

It is said that a jail inmate, who clicked the photo, had shared it with his wife and it was widely shared later.

Meanwhile, a video clip of around 10 seconds has also surfaced, in which a person on a video call gives the mobile phone to Darshan, who speaks to another person on the call.

No senior officials from the Department of Prisons and Correctional Services were available for a comment. The photo and video have surfaced a day after sleuths of the Central Crime Branch (CCB) raided the prison and carried out a search on the premises, including barracks, for contraband items, on Saturday. The police, after the search, had maintained that it was a routine search and no significant articles were seized.

A senior police officer said the photo has raised questions as to how Darshan got access to the cigarette and the actor could not have obtained it without the support of the prison staff.

Woman's head tonsured for fighting abusive husband, made to serve mutton feast

IN a shocking incident, a tribal woman of Rautbahal village under Jammal panchayat in Jharsuguda district was allegedly tonsured and forced to host a mutton feast for her community for standing up to her husband's oppressive ways.

Police arrested four persons in connection with the incident which took place on August 9 but came to light when the victim's son filed a complaint with Laikera police station late on Saturday. According to reports, the victim's husband, 65-year-old Mahendra Kisan, had a domestic dispute with his spouse during which the woman allegedly shoved him. An enraged Mahendra took up the matter

with his community council which convened a kangaroo court. The court decided that the woman's actions warranted harsh punishment. Led by local chiefs Naveen Ping, Shatrughan Kisan and Sushant Ping, it allegedly sanctioned dehumanization of the woman. The 45-year-old victim was subjected to physical assault, her head shaven and was forced to host a feast as atonement.

Upon learning about the incident, the victim's son, Niranjana Kisan who works in Tamil Nadu returned home and reported the matter to Sahapur outpost and subsequently at Laikera police station.

Mahendra. The accused have been charged and are currently in judicial custody. Further investigation is underway.

'Barricades placed at construction site, but there were no streetlights'

HIS body was sent to the Coimbatore Government Hospital for an autopsy and was handed over to the family by Sunday evening, sources said. Speaking to *TNIE*, a police official said, "There were barricades placed near the construction site, however, there were no streetlights. Since large warning signs or red reflective stick-

ers were not placed there, he could have fallen into the pit." He further added, "We will send a letter to the highways department seeking an explanation as to who is responsible for public safety near construction sites, the contractor or the highways department?"

Asked about this, a senior official from the state highways department denied the police's allegations, stating that work

has been ongoing for the past 12 days. "We ensured safety norms are followed before starting work. We placed Go Slow and Take Diversion boards.

The barricades had red reflective stickers on them. The death could have been caused by the motorist's own negligence. Still, we have planned to set up blinker lights at the site as an additional measure," he said.

A case has been registered under Sections 285, 106 (i) of BNS. Earlier, on August 14, 25-year-old I Manikandan, an electrician from Valuvur in Kuthalam, fell into a construction pit on the Mayiladuthurai-Tiruvarur Road near Elanthakudi village where bridge construction works were being carried out by the state highway department.

Following this, local resi-

dents staged a road blockade alleging that the site lacked barricades and warning signs.

On August 19, two youngsters from Theni, T Krishnamoorthi (21) and K Jayaprakash (22), who were on their way to Vembakottai from Badhrakalipuram, died after their two-wheeler hit a mound of soil and fell into a pit dug up as part of bridge construction works near Nathampatti.

KSRTC revives tourism in Wayanad with budget tours

THE Kerala State Road Transport Corporation (KSRTC) has resumed budget tourism trips to Wayanad in an effort to revitalise the district's tourism sector. The first group of travellers from Kannur arrived in Wayanad on Sunday. The budget tour, organised under the 'Aanavandi' initiative, transported members of the Thaliparamba Taluk Library Council to the district.

The Budget Tourism Cell has already arranged more than 300 trips to Wayanad from Kannur and other nearby depots. During this trip, passengers visited popular tourist spots such as Pookode Lake and Banasurasagar Dam. The group consisted of 38 people, including 36 passengers and two staff members.

This trip is our humble attempt to revive tourism in Wayanad, which contributes around 40% of the district's income," said Varghese C D, North Zonal Coordinator for Budget Tourism.

The initiative is reportedly receiving a strong response. "Following this trip, we have started receiving calls from many depots across the state. We already have 10 bookings for this month, and we expect a significant increase in bookings during the Onam holidays," Varghese added.
