Garlic costs Rs 500 per kilo in retail market

Farmers attribute it to less production

The price of garlic is skyrocketing in retail markets of Madhya Pradesh. Currently, its price is Rs 400 - Rs 500 per kilogram. According to some farmers, reduced cultivation areas led to less production in state, which resulted in a supply crunch in the market.

Garlic comes in large quantities to Neemuch Krishi Ujaj Mandi, one of the biggest mandis of the state, from Kota.

From Neemuch, garlic is sent to Maharashtra and southern states and almost the entire country. These days, garlic is being auctioned at high prices in mandis. This garlic is being auctioned for Rs 25,000 to about Rs 38,000 per quintal.

Farmer Kedar Sirohi said, "Area of garlic cultivation was quite low. Farmers did not show garlic in larger areas, so it led to crunch in garlic supply in market."

State Bharatiya Kisan Sangh president Kamal Singh Anjana said, "Areas for garlic cultivation was quite less, so there was less production leading to supply crunch in market. As a result, prices were skyrocketing. Neemuch, Ratlam, Malwa, Mahakoshal are main producers. But this time, farmers did not cultivate garlic in Mahakoshal and larger parts of Malwa. As a result, prices increased."

15 elected unopposed for AIMP executive committee

Withdrawal of nomination by 12 candidates on the last day avoids the need of conducting election

Official announcement in this regard will be made in AGM on September 21

In the biennial election of Executive Committee of Association of Industries of Madhya Pradesh (AIMP) for the Year 2024-26, 15 candidates were elected unopposed on Tuesday. Withdrawal of nomination papers by 12 candidates from a total of 27 on the last day, avoided the need of organising election on September 21.

Chief Election Officer of AIMP, Prabhu Saxeria and Additional Election Officer Nitin Tendulkar informed that for the election of new executive members of the association to be held for the year 2024-26, 12 candidates withdrew names on Tuesday, the last day of withdrawal of nominations. Thereafter, only 15 candidates were left for the post of 15-member executive committee, clearing the way of unopposed



election of all of them.

It may be pointed out that by the last date of submission

of nomination papers (August 20), nomination papers of 27 candidates had been received, which were found valid after detailed scrutiny. But on Tuesday, on the last day of withdrawal of nomination papers, 12 candidates out of 27 candidates withdrew their papers.

Now in the 65th Annual General Meeting (AGM) of AIMP, scheduled on September 21, the Election Committee will make official announcement in this

regard. The 12 candidates who withdrew their names are Dilip Dev, Pramod Jain, CM Jain, Dhruv Tolani, Madhusudan Bhalika, Dinesh Sharma, Jatinder Shaduja, Dharmendra Dosi (Ruchil), Manish Chaudhary, Dr Anil Kharia, Girish Punjabi and Vandana Shrivastava.

Man from UP arrested for theft at relative's place

The complainant and his family had gone abroad and the accused was aware of this

A man from UP was arrested for committing theft at a relative's place in the Kanadiya area, police said on Tuesday. The accused, who is facing a financial crunch, confessed to committing theft at the flat as he knew that the flat owner and his wife had gone abroad. Valuables worth Rs 8 lakh were recovered from the accused and further investigation is on.

Kanadiya police station in charge KP Yadav said that the theft occurred at the flat of Kavindra Kumar in Kalyan Sampat Garden between August 7 and August 14. The complainant informed the police that he had gone to China for his office work on July 27. After that his wife along with four relatives had also gone to

Hong Kong on August 7. When Kavindra returned to the city on August 14, he found his door open and valuables missing from the almirah of the flat.

He immediately informed the police about the same. Police investigated the spot and registered a case. A team was constituted for the arrest of the accused. Many CCTVs were examined by the police. The statements of the complainant and his wife were recorded. They allegedly revealed the name of their relative from UP as a suspect as he had visited the house when Kavindra was in China. At that time the complainant's wife had informed that she, along with other family members, were going to Hong Kong.

Later, police went to Bijnor in UP and caught suspect Subhash Singh, who allegedly confessed his crime. He informed the police that he was facing financial difficulties so he committed theft. On the lead given by the accused, police recovered valuables worth Rs 8 lakh from a house in the city.

Three woman, man held for duping people of lakhs
