

AYUSHMAN BHARAT SCHEME | Helping the patients Hosp suptd to issue letters to resolve fingerprint issues

The hospital superintendents, associated with MGM Medical College, in Indore will now issue letters to Bhopal explaining the difficulties faced by patients whose fingerprints do not match the records, ensuring that these patients remain eligible for Ayushman Bharat benefits.

This step comes as a relief for patients, especially cancer sufferers undergoing chemotherapy, who often experience changes in their fingerprints. Once these letters are submitted, patients will receive approval from the authorities in Bhopal to continue availing the benefits under the Ayushman scheme. This move is part of a

broader response to a concerning trend in the hospitals of MGM Medical College, where the number of Ayushman cardholders seeking treatment has decreased. Hospitals affiliated with MGM Medical College have seen a 10 per cent drop in the number of Ayushman patients. While 75 per cent of patients previously used

Ayushman cards for treatment, this figure has now fallen to 65 per cent. Given that Ayushman Bharat is a flagship program of both the central and state governments, the decline has prompted college management to take action. A review meeting was recently held in the medical college auditorium, attended by super-

intendents from all associated hospitals, to discuss the issue.

Several measures were decided upon to address the situation, including the establishment of dedicated centres for Ayushman card-related services in all hospitals. These centres aim to streamline the process for patients and prevent unnecessary delays. MGM Medical College dean Dr Sanjay Dixit said.

Additionally, the college administration has decided to extend Ayushman Bharat benefits to patients from other states. To ensure seamless treatment and funding, hospital authorities will coordinate with officials from the patients' home states to secure reimbursement under the scheme, Dr Dixit added.

IT engineer felicitates police officers for getting back money



He was duped of Rs 1 lakh in two instalments by cybercriminal

An IT engineer, who was duped of Rs 1 lakh by the cybercriminal a few months ago, on Wednesday felicitated the officials of Zone-1 cyber help desk for their excellent job for returning entire money to him. Additional DCP (zone-1) Alok Sharma said that Deepak Mehta, an IT engineer and the resident of Silicon City, had lodged a complaint that he was duped of Rs 1 lakh in two instalments by a conman, who posed as an officer of a bank. The complainant had applied for the credit card and then he had received a bill with an amount of Rs 10,000 and GST.

Then, he contacted a number which was searched for by him from the internet but he didn't get a satisfactory reply. On June 15, he had received a call from a person, who posed himself as a social account handler of the bank. Then, he had told him to waive off the charges of his card. The caller had taken OTPs from the complainant and managed to transfer Rs 1 lakh in two instalments from the card of the complainant. The accused had also asked him for another OTP on the pretext of returning his money but the complainant didn't share the same and he had lodged a complaint with the police. Sharma further said that the team of cyber desk gathered the details of the transaction and managed to return the amount to the complainant to his bank account.
