HALF A CENTURY OF DYNASTY RULE COMES TO AN END

A lightning offensive by Islam-led rebels toppled Syrian president Bashar al-Assad on Sunday. A look back

1970: Hafez al-Assad, Syria's defence minister and the father of Bashar, takes power in a bloodless military coup on November 16, 1970. Assad, who leads the Baath Party, is elected president on March 12, 1971. He is the only candidate. He is first head of state Alawite Muslim sect

1973: Egypt and Syria launch an attack on Israel on October 6, 1973 in a bid to win back territories they lost in the June 1967 war but they are pushed back

1976: In June 1974, US president Richard Nixon visits Damascus and announces the re-establishment of diplomatic relations with Syria, frozen since 1967. Two years later, Syrian troops enter Lebanon during the civil war with United States' support after an appeal by embattled Christian forces

1982: Assad's army carries out a massacre in Hama in central Syria, killing thousands of people. The killings targeted people accused of being members of the banned Muslim Brotherhood

1990: After a period of tensions, Syria's ties with the United States begin to thaw in 1990-1991, following the collapse of the Soviet Union. Syria joins the US-led coalition against Saddam Hussein after Iraq invades Kuwait

2000: Hafez al-Assad dies on June 10, 2000, aged 69. The same day Parliament amends the constitution. A month later, Bashar al-Assad becomes Syria's new head of state, winning a referendum with 97% of the vote

2000: In September that year, 100 intellectuals call for the lifting of martial law, in place since 1963, more freedom and political pluralism. This becomes known as the "Damascus Spring"

2011: In March 2011, protesters take to the streets of towns and cities around Syria, defying Assad's zero-tolerance for dissent. Inspired by the Arab Spring, the protesters called for civil liberties and freedom for political prisoners, facing tremendous personal risk and with many paying with their lives. The demonstrators face a brutal crack down and a nearly 14-year full-blown civil war ensues

DAMASCUS

OUSTED Syrian leader Bashar Assad fled to Moscow and received asylum from his longtime ally, Russian media said on Sunday, hours after a stunning rebel advance seized control of Damascus and ended his family's 50 years of iron rule. The arrival of Assad and his family in Moscow was reported by Russian agencies *Tass* and *RIA*, citing an unidentified source at the Kremlin. *RIA* also said Syrian insurgents had guaranteed the security of Russian military bases and diplomatic posts in Syria.

Earlier, Russia said Assad left Syria after negotiations with rebel groups and that he had given instructions to transfer power peacefully.

The leader of Syria's biggest rebel faction, Abu Mohammed al-Golani, is poised to chart the country's future. The former al-Qaida commander cut ties with the group years ago and says he embraces pluralism and religious tolerance.

His Hayat Tahrir al-Sham group, or HTS, is considered a terrorist organisation by the US and the UN. In his first public appearance since fighters

entered the Damascus suburbs Saturday, al-Golani visited the Umayyad Mosque and described Assad's fall as "a victory to the Islamic nation." Calling himself by his given name, Ahmad al-Sharaa, and not his nom de guerre, he said Assad had made Syria "a farm for Iran's greed."

The rebels face the daunting task of healing bitter divisions in a country ravaged by war and split among armed factions. Turkey-backed opposition fighters are battling US-allied Kurdish forces in the north, and the IS group is still active in remote areas.

Rebel commander Anas Salkhadi appeared on state TV and sought to reassure religious and ethnic minorities, saying: "Syria is for everyone, no exceptions. Syria is for Druze, Sunnis, Alawites, and all sects." "We will not deal with people the way the Assad family did," he added.

Meanwhile Syria's prime minister said on Monday that most cabinet ministers are still working from offices in Damascus. Streams of refugees crossed back into Syria from neighbouring countries. AP

Families search for their loved ones in Saydnaya jail basement, dungeons

DAMASCUS

SYRIAN rescuers searched a jail synonymous with the worst atrocities of ousted president Bashar al-Assad's rule, as people in the capital flocked to a central square to celebrate their country's freedom.

On Monday, rescuers from the Syrian White Helmets group said they were searching for potential secret doors or basements in Saydnaya prison, though they said there was no immediate sign that anyone was trapped.

"We are working with all our energy to reach a new hope, and we must be prepared for the worst," the organisation said in a statement, urging families of the missing to have "patience".

Aida Taha, aged 65, said she had been "roaming the streets like a madwoman" in search of her brother, who was arrested in 2012. "We've been oppressed long enough, we want our children back," she said.

During the offensive launched on Nov 27, rebels wrested city from Assad's control, opening the gates of prisons along the way and freeing thousands of people, many of them held on political charges. Social media groups were alight with Syrians sharing images of detainees reportedly brought out from the dungeons, in a collective effort to reunite families with their newly released loved ones, some of whom had been missing for years.

Others, like Fadwa Mahmoud, whose husband and son are missing, posted calls for help finding their missing relatives.

"Where are you, Maher and Abdel Aziz, it's time for me to hear your news, oh God, please come back, let my joy become complete," wrote Mahmoud, herself a former detainee. AFP



Israel says buffer zone capture is temporary

Jerusalem: Israel's Foreign Minister Gideon Saar said Monday that his country's military takeover of the buffer zone along its border with Syria was a "limited and temporary step". "This is a limited and temporary step we took for security reasons," Saar said in a press conference at the foreign ministry in Jerusalem. Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu announced on Sunday that he had ordered the army to "take control" of the zone after the fall of Syrian president Bashar Al-Assad. In 1974 a buffer zone was established with UN peacekeepers stationed there. AFP

Israel strikes chemical weapons sites in Syria

JERUSALEM

ISRAELI Foreign Minister Gideon Saar said on Monday that his country had struck "chemical weapons" in neighbouring Syria.

Speaking at a press conference, Saar said "we attacked strategic weapon systems like,

for example, remaining chemical weapons or long-range missiles and rockets in order that they will not fall in the hands of extremists". Saar said Israel was monitoring the actions of the rebels, adding: "The steps we took, the only interest we have is the security of Israel and its citizens." AFP
