'AI PLAYS KEY ROLE IN PREVENTIVE HEALTHCARE'

India's first AI-powered CT FFR technology launched at Aster Ramesh Hospitals

CHIEF cardiologist Dr Pothineni Ramesh Babu stated that artificial intelligence (AI) is now playing a crucial role in medical diagnostics. Aster Ramesh Hospitals has introduced the Computed Tomography-Fractional Flow Reserve (CT-FFR) test for the first time in the country.

Addressing the media conference here on Sunday, Dr Ramesh Babu said that advanced AI technologies are significantly improving precision diagnostics and treatment in various medical fields such as cardiology, neurology, oncology, genomics, and single-cell atlas research.

Before entering the cath lab, it is possible to determine whether a patient needs stents, how many are required, and their exact size using CT Angiogram, FFR and plaque morphology assessments. This cutting-edge on-site CT Angiogram FFR equip-

ment, which has received Conformité Européenne (CE) approval, has been installed for the first time at Aster Ramesh Hospitals in Ongole, Guntur and Vijayawada. This test allows doctors to determine whether a patient needs stents while they are still in

the CT scan room. Referring to the dilemma of stent or bypass surgery, he said that the decision between bypass surgery and stents is crucial, particularly when all three major blood vessels are blocked, especially in diabetic patients. While stents may be sufficient for some, clinical data suggests that bypass surgery provides better long-term outcomes for the majority. Dr Ramesh Babu asserts that a stress test should not be performed before a CT Angiogram or Catheter Angiogram. According to the American Heart Association guidelines, a stress test is not required as a first-line test in 50 per cent of patients, he stated.

Speaking on the occasion, Minister Veeranjanya Swamy outlined several key initiatives, including a renewable energy industry in Kanigiri, a leather park in Giddalur, and the upcoming integration of Ramayapatnam Port and Horticultural University areas into the Prakasam district.

He also revealed plans for a Bharat Petroleum refinery

The minister also highlighted plans for tourism development, aquaculture expansion, and granite industry promotion. Collector Ansariya emphasised that development strategies would align with the state government's Vision-2047 ten-point agenda, noting that Prakasam is geographically the largest district in the state.

The celebration included cultural performances by children and recognition of freedom fighters' families and distinguished district personalities.

The event was attended by various officials and public representatives including AP Maritime Board Chairman Damacharla Satyanarayana, APTDC Chairman Dr Nukasanai Balaji, and other key government representatives.

Endoscopic surgery successfully treats rare eye tumour

THE doctors at KIMS Hospital here have successfully performed a minimally invasive surgery to remove a rare tumour that was displacing a patient's eye.

KIMS Ongole medical director Dr T Srihari Reddy explained that a 55-year-old woman presented at the hospital's outpatient department with severe pain and lateral displacement of her right eye. He said that the ENT Surgeon Dr Konagalla Karthik performed the tests and diagnosed her with Ethmoid sinus mucocoele, an uncommon condition that, in this case, had extended into the orbital area, threatening the patient's vision. Breaking from traditional approaches that typically require major open surgery, Dr Karthik opted for an advanced endoscopic technique, eliminating the need for external incisions, he

said. The procedure, led by Dr Karthik, marks a milestone for advanced medical care in non-metropolitan areas, he appreciated.

Dr Karthik said the decision helped avoid significant risks associated with conventional surgery, including potential nerve damage and vision loss. The procedure proved successful, with the patient's vision returning to normal and eye swelling subsiding post-operation. Dr Karthik expressed satisfaction with the outcome and acknowledged the medical team's collaborative effort to make the surgery possible. Emphasising the hospital's ongoing commitment to providing advanced medical treatments, KIMS Ongole Director T Giri Naidu said that the success of the treatment in Ongole represents a proud moment for their institution. The hospital's COO, K Anki Reddy, commended the surgical team's expertise.

Bone marrow transplant performed on 12-yr-old boy

THE first paediatric bone marrow transplant (BMT) was performed by American Oncology Institute (AOI) here marking a significant milestone in advanced Cancer Care in the region. The transplant was performed on a 12-year-old boy, Uday Vikas P, who was diagnosed with Hodgkin's Lymphoma. Uday initially presented with neck swelling and was diagnosed with Hodgkin's Lymphoma. It's a type of cancer that affects the lymphatic system commonly known as the body's immune system.

After receiving three cycles of chemotherapy, the young patient underwent a bone marrow transplant. Today, he is in good health under regular follow-up care. Medical Oncologist Dr Sai Krishna Kolluru says, "The treatment and management of Hodgkin's Lymphoma in a child requires a multidisciplinary approach and precise care. Uday's case was particularly critical due to the complexity of the disease and the need for a bone marrow transplant."
